STORM WATER REGULATIONS ARE IN EFFECT. State Mandate: All municipalities must remove loose debris from curb areas within seven (7) days or residents will be required to bag leaves and yard waste placed at the curb. Failure to comply will subject the City to fines. In an effort to prevent our residents from mandatory bagging of leaves and yard waste, it is crucial that all yard waste and leaves be placed at curb no later than 6 A.M. the day of pickup.

DO NOT MIX BRUSH AND LEAVES. THEY WILL NOT BE PICKED UP

Brush and Tree parts:

All brush and tree parts **MUST** be tied and bundled.

- Maximum length – 4 feet
- Maximum weight – 50 pounds

Maximum bundles per pickup – 8

Oversized or untied brush and tree parts are an improper putout and will be subject to citation by a City Code Enforcement Officer. Residents or private contractors can take brush and tree parts, in excess of the above limits, to the PMUA, Rock Avenue Transfer Station. Fees will apply. PROPERTY OWNERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REMOVAL OF THEIR PRIVATE TREES OR TREE PARTS WHEN THEY EXCEED THE ABOVE LIMITATIONS.

FALL CLEANUP – Leaves and Yard Waste:

Place leaves and yard waste at curb loose or in biodegradable paper bags **ONLY**. Bags are available at the City Yard, 745 South Avenue. **DO NOT** contaminate with litter, dirt, grass, garbage or any other foreign objects. Plastic bags are an illegal putout and will be subject to a citation by a City Code Enforcement Officer.

Grass will not be picked up at anytime during the program. DO NOT place loose leaves or bagged leaves at the curb until the scheduled pickup date (see map and schedule inside). Maximum bag weight: 50 pounds.

- **DO NOT MIX BAGS WITH BUNDLED BRUSH!!!**
Mixed leaves and brush will not be picked up.



From the Mayor's Desk

Dear Plainfield residents,

After some of the scorching days, we experienced this past summer, I am sure many of you are looking forward to the cooler days of fall. Fall, however, brings its challenges such as downed leaves, etc. I am therefore pleased to provide you with the fall curbside collection schedule.

As part of our continued effort to make Plainfield environmentally friendly, we want you to continue to bag yard waste in biodegradable bags only. For your convenience, these bags will be available, free of charge, at Public Works, located at 745 South Avenue. **Plastic bags will not be accepted—let's all do our part to keep Plainfield beautiful.**

Road maintenance and clean streets remain a top priority for my administration. With rising operational costs, I continue to challenge my team to find creative ways to meet the needs of our residents while keeping cost to a minimum. Listed below are some solutions we have implemented.

- Pothole repairs: The pothole Doctor has been on the road making service calls. Utilizing spray injection technology from the safety of the Pothole doctor cab, a single operator controls a hydraulic boom, which clears the pothole of debris, applies liquid asphalt to fill, seals it and tops it off with a dry aggregate coating. The repaired roadway is immediately ready to handle traffic. The repairs last longer than the cold patch method which was used in the past. There is also a reduction in labor cost.
- We continued to share services with the Union County Road Division. Public Works staff utilized County employees and County equipment to assist with the completion of several large spot milling and repaving projects. This eliminated the need for costly rental charges.

- In-house Training Program: Fifteen (15) employees participated in our road maintenance program. These employees received training on road construction, maintenance and equipment.
- Cost savings benefits through cooperative purchasing. This fall several streets will be milled and resurfaced utilizing the purchasing power of over 200 Municipalities.
- Street Sweeping: Crews performed 7-day street sweeping for the Urban Enterprise Zone. Street sweeping crews logged a total of 5,490 miles, removing a total of over 1,800 tons of debris from our city streets.
- Mayor's Light Up The City Program: Over 300 street lights were reported and serviced by Public Service. Poorly lit streets received new or upgraded lighting fixtures.
- Street Signage Replacement: Utilizing the summer youth program workers, over 200 faded and missing street signs were replaced.


